## SECTION 4 – FIRST AID MEASURES

Sweep up and shovel or collect recovery product into labelled containers for recycling or salvage, and dispose of promptly. ## SECTION 7 – HANDLING AND STORAGE

<b>Storage</b>	Keep out of reach of children. Store in original container, tightly closed, away from human and animal foodstuffs, medicines and remedies, seeds, fungicides, herbicides and fertilisers. Segregate from incompatible hazardous substances (Classes 1, 4 & 5). Store in a cool, dry, well ventilated place and protect from sunlight.
