Dispose of recovered material through a designated hazardous substances disposal facility or contact the local regional/district council for disposal information.

SECTION 7 – HANDLING AND STORAGE

Storage	Keep out of reach of children. Store under lock and key, in original container, tightly closed, away from human and animal foodstuffs, medicines and remedies, seeds and fertilisers. Segregate from incompatible hazardous substances/dangerous goods (Classes 1, 4 & 5). Store in a cool, dry, well-ventilated place and protect from sunlight.
